

Kingborough



As Council, we face increasing financial pressures with rising building and maintenance costs associated with the \$850M worth of community assets we manage. For the 23/24 financial year, Council is looking at an operating loss of \$2.3M, followed by a draft operating loss of \$2.9M in the 24/25 financial year.

Unlike businesses or other entities, Council has limited income streams with 85% coming from rates, fees and charges. Unfortunately, because we have maintained low rates over the last ten years, considerably lower than many other Councils, we must now increase rates.

Councillors have listened to the feedback provided by the community during the consultation period and the rate increase was lowered from the proposed 12% to 9.8%. We understand that there are cost of living pressures, and that some ratepayers may be experiencing financial difficulties. This is why we have also amended our Financial Hardship Policy to assist those community members.

Rates

The 2024-25 budget is based on a 9.8 % **residential**, **commercial** and **industrial** rate increase.

Financial Hardship

Council understands that from time to time some ratepayers may have difficulty paying their rates due to financial hardship.

Compostable Dog Poo Bags

Kingborough Council will introduce compostable dog poo bags for the 115 dog bag dispensers in various locations around Kingborough.

The community uses around 760,000 bags a year which have traditionally been made of plastic. This will mean less plastic will end up in landfill.

State Government Charges

The bin collection charge on your Rates Notice includes the recovery of the State Government's Landfill Waste Levy, which will improve waste management and resource recovery in Tasmania.

This levy increases in the 2024/2025 financial year for garbage bin collection:
