SUBDIVISION AT 180 ALLENS RIVULET ROAD, ALLENS RIVULET (DAS-2022-30) FURTHER INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to the above matter, and a conversation I had by phone with Robyn Bevilacqua on 15 August 2023.

Based on that conversation, I understand that the reason Council did not accept our previous advice in relation to the status of Cranes Road (set out in my letter dated 13 July) was that it had received legal advice that section 95 of the *Local Government (Building and Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1983* did not apply.

Specifically, I understand Council takes the view that section 95 only applies to land which is the <u>subject</u> <u>of</u> a sealed plan, not any land "shown on" the sealed plan in a broader sense.

While we do not necessarily agree with that interpretation, there is another basis on which Council can be satisfied that the relevant section of Cranes Road is a road within the meaning of the planning scheme, even without any recourse to section 95.

A. EVIDENCE

1. Additional Survey Plans

- 1.1. I **enclose** with this letter a survey plan applying to land labelled (in the top left corner) 'P. W. ROAD No 743'.
- 1.2. This plan depicts Cranes Road, from the point where it connects to Allens Rivulet Road, to a point well beyond my client's land.
- 1.3. The relevant section of Cranes Road is referred to on this plan as 'Public Works Road 25 Links Wide'. A Gazette date is given, of '19/6/06'.

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2. Hobart Gazette 19 June 1906

- 2.1. The Hobart Gazette issued on 19 June 1906 contains a proclamation relevant to Cranes Road. A copy of that issue of the Gazette is **enclosed**, with the relevant proclamation being found on page 704 (**the Proclamation**).
- 2.2. It reads:

A PROCLAMATION

Whereas by virtue of the provisions of "The Crown Lands Act, 1903" the Minister of Lands and Works is empowered to acquire land for Road purposes, and it is deemed necessary to acquire the Land described in the Schedule hereto for a new line of road, situate at Longley, in Tasmania: Now therefore I, Sir Gerald Strickland, Count Della Catena, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Tasmania and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia; in Council, in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Parliament of Tasmania, intituled "The Land Vesting Act, 1894" (58 Vict. No. 17), do, by this my Proclamation, define by metes and bounds the said Road, as appears by the Schedule to this Proclamation.

2.3. The Schedule to the Proclamation reads:

Schedule COUNTY OF BUCKINGHAM, PARISH OF KINGBOROUGH.

0a. 2r. 20p. – Being portion of Lot 3597 purchased by James Thompson, and portion of Lot 16237 purchased by Daniel Crane, now the property of Daniel Crane. No. 743 (Vol. CL., Fol. 192C.T.)

Bounded on the north-west by 12 chains 27 3/10 links south-westerly along 61a. 2r. 13p. of land owned by Daniel Crane commencing at a reserved road again on the north-west by 12 chains 86 4/10 links south-westerly along 16a. 2r. 10p. of land owned by Walter Crane on the south and south-east by 25 chains 11 1/10 links easterly and north-easterly in 3 bearings and thence on the north-east by 25 7/10 links north-westerly along the beforementioned reserved road to the point of commencement.

- 2.4. An identical proclamation is found in two subsequent issues of the Hobart Gazette on 26 June 1906 and 3 July 1906.




Figure 1: extract from enclosed survey plan depicting Cranes Road. For convenience I have highlighted the relevant measurements referred to in the Schedule to the Proclamation.

- 2.5. A review of the enclosed survey plans against the description given in the Schedule confirms that this relates to the section of Cranes Road shown in the below extract (figure 1).
- 2.6. The third page of the enclosed scanned survey plan also contains the lot size measurements referred to in the Schedule (61a. 2r. 13p. owned by Daniel Crane, and 16a. 2r. 10p. owned by Walter Crane), again making it clear that the Proclamation relates to that section of Cranes Road.

B. LEGAL EFFECT OF THE PROCLAMATION

- 3. The Lands Vesting Act, 1894
- 3.1. The Proclamation is made pursuant to the provisions of "The Lands Vesting Act, 1894" (58 Vict. No. 17).

- 3.2. The full title of that Act is An Act to Make Better Provision for Vesting in Her Majesty the Queen Land Acquired for Roads and for Other Purposes, and it was passed on 25 August 1894.
- 3.3. Section 1 of that Act read as follows:
 - (1) Whenever the Minister of Lands and Works is empowered to acquire land for road purposes, and it is deemed necessary to acquire any land for a new line of road, or to alter or deviate any existing line of road, the Governor in Council may, with the consent in writing of all persons interested in such land, and upon payment of such compensation (if any) to the owners, or the purchase-money to the Crown, as the case may be, as by law provided, by Proclamation published Three times in the Hobart Gazette, and in a newspaper published nearest to the said road, define by metes and bounds the proposed new line of road, or the alteration or deviation of the existing line of road, and the existing line of road, or the portions thereof proposed to be stopped up.
 - (2) Upon the registration of the said Proclamation in the Office of the Registry of Deeds, Hobart, or in the Lands' Titles Office, Hobart, as hereinafter mentioned, the new line of road, or the deviation or alteration of the existing road, as the case may be, shall be dedicated as a public highway, and shall revert to and revest in her Majesty the Queen for all the estate and interest originally granted by Her said Majesty, freed and discharged from all incumbrances, estates, and interests of all persons whatsoever, and the existing line of road, or the portions thereof proposed to be stopped up, shall cease to be a public



highway, and shall vest in fee simply in the owners of the fee simply of the immediately adjoining lands as though duly granted by Her said Majesty, and shall be subject to such and the same incumbrances and interests as such adjoining lands are subject to.

(emphasis added)

- 3.4. Clearly, the Proclamation in the Gazette is a proclamation under section 1(1) of this Act. The registration of the Proclamation therefore triggered section 1(2) of the Act.
- 3.5 Evidence of the registration of the proclamation is **enclosed**, so the Council can be satisfied that all preconditions for the operation of section 1(2) of the Act were in fact met, with the result that the land was "dedicated as a public highway" upon registration of the Proclamation on 20 July
- 3.6. This dedication as a "public highway" gave the public a permanent right of passage over this section of Cranes Road.¹ The Kingborough Interim Planning Scheme 2015 defines a "road" as any land over which the public have a permanent right of passage.²
- Consequently, Cranes Road is a 'road' for the purposes of the planning scheme, at least up until the point where it turns to cross the property at 30 Cranes Road (CT 165279/4), which is beyond the point relevant to my client's subdivision.

I trust this satisfies the Council's request for further information insofar as it relates to road frontage.
