MAIN ISSUES RAISED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS:	Can council give an update on apparent changes to entry at some council halls by adopting an entry app instead of a key system. Also has the council recently raised the fees for hall hire and is there any discount for regular users? <u>Reply:</u> Council is in the process of installing a digital key system at some of our Community Halls. The system has been installed at Margate, Sandfly and Blackmans Bay Halls, with installation at Kingston Beach occurring on 5 <sup>th</sup> September. At this stage we don't have plans to instal the system at any other community/committee managed halls. Kingborough Council's Fees and Charges Schedule is reviewed annually as part of the budgeting process. There has been a small increase in the hire fees for community use and commercial activities, however, there has been a reduction in costs for those businesses that offer sport/recreation/fitness activities, such as aerobics and yoga classes. This has been implemented to recognise the health and wellbeing benefits that these activities provide the community, and to encourage more use of our halls for activities of this nature. There are no discounts offered to regular users. Kingborough's Fees and Charges Schedule for the 2024-25 financial year is available on Council's website.

	Our committee is made up of six who work full time or have part time work and young children. We live close to the meetings but still find that the Saturday morning timing is very difficult as so much of our down time or family time is taken to attend. Attending in the evening would be somewhat easier. We realise that this might be harder for members from Bruny and further south to attend and suggest the use of zoom/teams to balance this. This would also permit members to attend whilst still being able to be at home caring for children etc.

	We would like to recommend a shorter meeting time and a decent amount of that time being given to members for simple
	connection through conversation. This could be loosely structured

UPDATE ON COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES	The committee of the Leslie Vale Community Group met on 1 September to consider a few issues that have recently arisen. The committee was delighted to welcome Inspector Colin Riley from Kingston Police and Kingborough Council's Senior Road Engineer to the meeting.
	Leslie Rd / Huon Hwy intersection – speed limit and other considerations
	The safety of this intersection continues to be of concern to local residents. The committee recently wrote to the Department of State Growth advocating for a reduction in speed limit to 80 km/h on the approaches to the intersection as an interim measure pending more substantial remedial activity.
	\$50 million was earmarked in this year's federal budget for works on the Huon Road corridor. Your committee will be advocating for some of this funding to be allocated to this intersection which has been identified in studies to be in need of upgrading. NO work has been done here since the southern outlet was opened in 1968.
OTHER	Leslie Rd truck traffic – solutions being investigated Concerns have recently (and not so recently) been expressed by locals about the increase in heavy vehicle traffic on Leslie Rd between the old and new Huon Roads as a consequence of development works in the Kingborough area dumping excavation spoil at the Websters Rd quarry. A number of recent incidents have been flagged on social media including trucks going off the road and near misses on pedestrians and other vehicles.
	A 40km/h speed limit was imposed on heavy vehicles for a year or so however traffic data reveals that this had little effect with average heavy vehicular traffic speeds approaching 70 km/h. The

Leslie Vale Community Group committee, with significant input from Council's Senior Road Engineer, recently discussed options to improve safety on this stretch of road with the outcome being that Council's engineer will investigate the feasibility of imposing a load limit on this road and/or seeking to have heavy vehicle traffic go in one direction only on the road. Note that imposing as load limit would NOT prohibit heavy vehicle traffic but would impose enforceable conditions (such as a 40 km/h speed limit) - with significant penalties applicable for breaches of any of the conditions.
HBMI quarry expansion proposal
The next key moment on the timeline for the Hazel Bros proposal to double the output of its Leslie Vale quarry is the release for public comment of the Environmental Impact Statement it must submit to the Tasmanian Environmental Protection Agency. While this was anticipated by the committee to be released in the middle of this year, it has not yet occurred. When it is released, the committee will examine it and, in consultation with the local community, develop a response that safeguards the community's access to a safe and amenable living environment.
HBMI Blasting
On a related note, the committee is monitoring the impact of HBMI existing blasting procedures on local residents and is continuing to seek feedback about this.
Leslie Vale Oval Defibrillator
The committee was saddened to hear that the EAD that was placed at the oval early in 2024 has gone missing. While it is hoped it may still be recovered and returned to the oval, should this not be the case the committee was investigate alternative options. The theft has been reported to Tas Police and Ambulance.

	<ul> <li>3. Footpath (gravelled) along Channel Hwy between Old Station Road and Davies Road Reply:</li> <li>Design yet to commence on this project, construction planned for next calendar year</li> </ul>
	Has there been any progress on securing the title needed for the Snug to Lower Snug shared Path?
	<b>Reply</b> : Council has reached out to relatives of the deceased estate wo are trying to establish ownership of this property several times, but this matter has not yet been resolved.
